LightRecycle Washington is a beacon of environmental responsibility. Established on January 1st, 2015, our non-profit program is dedicated to the safe and convenient recycling of mercury-containing lights at no charge for the residents of Washington State.

Residents can drop off their fluorescent, CFL, and HID lights at our numerous collection sites throughout the state. The lights are then transported to an authorized processor, where they are carefully sorted, crushed, and recycled in compliance with EPA regulations. With millions of these lights sold annually in Washington State, we aim to prevent mercury from entering our ecosystem.

At the heart of LightRecycle Washington lies a passionate team of environmentally-minded solution providers. We desire to help individuals and businesses make a positive impact on the world by ensuring that spent, unwanted, or broken lights are recycled.

Accepted items: The program accepts Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFLs) of all shapes and sizes, fluorescent tubes, including straight, u-shaped, curved, or circular tubes, broken lights in sealed containers, and High-Intensity Discharge (HID) lamps, such as High-Pressure Sodium, Mercury Vapour, Metal Halide, Ultraviolet (UV), Ultra High Performance (UHP), and Germicidal.

Non-accepted items: Residents are encouraged to visit 1800recycle.wa.gov or call 1-800-RECYCLE to recycle items other than mercury-containing lights.
